

Phonics Screening Check Survival: Week 7 Session 4

Preparation	<p>Print out: Car Park sheet, 'ey' Poster, 'ey' Riddles, Word Spinner sheet and 'ey' Spotter Postcard.</p> <p>Trim: Word Spinner sheet.</p> <p>Resources: Toy cars, sharp pencils and sticky tack.</p>
Warm-Up	<p>Car Park Phonics</p> <p>Give each child a copy of Car Park Phonics sheet and a toy car. Read aloud one of the words from the mat. Ask the children to move their toy car to park it in the correct space. Encourage the child to read and check their answers by sound talking and blending the word they have parked their car on. You may wish to use this order: clay, joy, pird, whib, clue, vray, blout, pies, when, firp, meat, paw.</p> <p><i>Can the child speedily and accurately read real and nonsense Phase 5 words?</i></p>
Input	<p>All About ey</p> <p>Use the 'ey' Sound Poster to introduce the sound. Remind the children that 'ey' is a digraph, explaining that the two letters work together to make one sound. Model saying the 'ey' sound aloud. Ensure your pronunciation is clear and it is a pure sound. Ask the children to repeat the sound back to you until you are happy they are confident and clear in their sound production.</p> <p>Give each child a prepared Word Spinner. Push a sharp pencil through the middle, ensuring that the sharp tip is then covered by some sticky tack. Model using the spinner and reading the word it lands on. Encourage the children to decode the word aloud. <i>Is the child able to decode words containing 'ey'?</i></p>
Apply	<p>ey Riddles</p> <p>Give each child an 'ey' Riddles sheet. Children to read each riddle carefully aloud. Allow them time to identify the answer from a bank of 'ey' words at the bottom of the page. Check the answers and discuss any errors.</p> <p><i>Can the child accurately read and understand words containing 'ey'?</i></p>
Assess and Review	<p>ey Spotter Postcard</p> <p>Give each child a copy of the 'ey' Spotter Postcard. Explain that they need to read through the postcard aloud. Ask the child to circle all of the words containing the 'ey' digraph. Check the answers as a group and discuss any misconceptions.</p> <p><i>Can the child accurately identify and read words containing 'ey' within sentences?</i></p>
