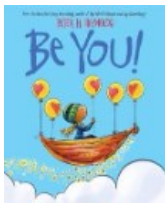

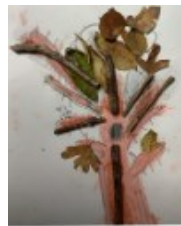


The children have settled in brilliantly within school right from our very youngest to our growing Year 5s and Year 6s. Our values are truly embedded within each and everything children do,

# Leave of Absence During Term Time - Information for Parents

## Attendance Ladder

How close is your child to 100%?

0 days off school	100%	Perfection
Equates to 2 days off school each year	99%	Excellent
Equates to 5 days off school each year	97%	Good
Equates to 10 days off school each year	95%	Slight Concern
Equates to 20 days off school each year	90%	Concerned
Equates to 30 days off school each year	85%	Very Concerned

**Attendance Matters** We review individual attendance each half term and will contact you to offer support if your child falls below 95%.

Our term dates for the whole academic year are included on the back page of this newsletter and on the school website.

Please ensure that you refer to these before booking or planning holidays to ensure they are within school holiday dates. In line with Government legislation, I am not permitted to authorise any in term holidays. We are committed to working in partnership with you to enable your child to succeed. For this to happen we need to ensure that pupils attend school everyday – there are only 190 school days a year, so everyday counts!

Having the best attendance possible underpins all the many benefits of school for your child, such as their opportunities for learning, supporting their wellbeing and enabling their wider development. As always, we ask that parents and carers work with us to promote and encourage good attendance.

Penalty Notices Fines for school unauthorised absence and lateness is changing. All money received is collected by the local authority and used to fund the service. **School receives none of this money.** The school attendance data is automatically shared with the local authority and the Department for Education.

### FIRST OCCURRENCE

01

The **first time** a Penalty Notice is issued for the **term time leave or irregular attendance or lateness** (after registers close) the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

TWO

### SECOND OCCURRENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

02

The **second time** a Penalty Notice is issued for **term time leave or irregular attendance or lateness** (after the registers close) the amount will be:

£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days

No reduction rate will be offered.

THREE

### THIRD OCCURRENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCE

03

The **third time** an offence is committed for **term time leave or irregular attendance or lateness** (after registers close) a **Penalty Notice will not be issued** and the case will be presented straight to the **Magistrates' court** which can be up to:

£2,500 per parent, per child.

Case found guilty in Magistrates' court can show on a **DBS certificate for a parent**, due to the failure in **safeguarding a child's education**.

### 10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD

A Penalty Notice Fine will be considered when there has been **10 sessions of unauthorised absence (including lateness after registers are closed)** in a **rolling 10 week period**. This can span different terms and academic years.

As part of celebrating your child's achievements as they have settled into their new class, we will be having parents evening on Monday 24 November and Thursday 27 November.

This year, parents evening will be **face to face** and meetings will be held in your child's classroom where you will have the opportunity to look at your child's books before discussing their progress and wellbeing with class teachers. Each slot will last for approximately five to ten minutes. This is a brilliant opportunity for you to see your child's learning and teachers will share your child's targets and next steps for their learning.

We feel that the partnership between home and school is extremely important and encourage all parents to make every effort to attend parents evening.

## Photo Consent

Could we remind parents/carers that we keep a record of photographic consent for your child for the duration of their school life with us if you would like to amend it in any way please login to the sims parent app.

**Important** - If you have indicated NO for the option 'Images made available to purchase via a restricted website, subject to a secure password eg photos taken by professional photographer arranged by school for annual head and class shots' - then unfortunately when the school photographer is able to attend for the annual head shots, your child will not be able to take part.

Please note if you have not completed a consent form or updated your data collection information through sims parent, we will assume that you are happy for your child's photo to be used/taken internally within school for use on their sims record and for identification purposes.

## Universal Free School Meals & Free School Meals - What is the difference?

Every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 is entitled to a free school dinner everyday (Universal Free School Meals).

However if your child is entitled to additional funding you can register for Free School Meals (Pupil Premium), which could raise additional funds for your child's education - enabling us to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff, after school activities, school trips and help towards school uniform costs.

This additional money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the welfare benefits listed on Warwickshire County Council's website. For more information or to complete your online application please visit <https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/education-learning/apply-free-school-meals>

It's vital to sign up for Pupil Premium, even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 so that your child's school receives as much funding as possible.

Important - Please also notify the school if your child has a parent in the Armed Forces or your child is adopted as they may also qualify for pupil premium.

## Authorised Pupil Collection

Remember only mum/dad/legal guardian can collect a child after school unless the collecting individual is named on the Authorised Pupil Collection Form.

Please ensure your forms are up to date - spares are available on the school website or in the Reception area. We will not take changes to collection over the telephone, all changes must be made in writing.

## Book Bags

Your child's first book bag at the start of Reception (or as a new starter in full time school) is provided free of charge. However in the event you need to replace this during their time here, you can purchase a new bag via the office at a cost of £7.00.

## Data Collection Sheets - Action Required by 26 September

For those children on roll on the first week of term data collection sheets have been sent home for checking, amending as necessary, signing and returning to school by the 26 September.

It is vitally important that you check all the phone numbers, email addresses and home address have been entered accurately and that all the data is current.

The parents/carers/contacts are in the correct priority order. In an emergency we will start with number 1 and work our way down the list.

The data collection sheet is not your pupil collection sheet, this is the data we hold in school for your child and would be used to make emergency arrangements.

## School Fund Donation

Annual School fund donations can be made via the School Gateway App (suggested Donation £10.00), if possible please do so by the 30 September to enable us to plan the year. This contribution goes towards various expenses, including items such as ingredients for cookery, parties and events, plus visitors to school and various school trips and outings throughout the year.

Thank you for supporting our school to offer your child an interesting and exciting learning experience.

## What should I do if my child is Unwell/Has an Appointment?

**Unwell** - It is important that you ring the school before 9.30am in the morning on 01788 547660 (option 1) and report your that your child is not going to be in and the reason why.

**Appointment** - If they are attending a medical appointment please provide a copy of the medical letter as far in advance as possible and discuss the arrangements for the day with the office (ie will they be in for a portion of the day, will they require lunch). If it is an emergency appointment please leave a message on the attendance line and if they will be back before lunch please remember to leave their meal choice as well in your message - so that their dinner is ordered.
